Formed in 2005, The Trust took over the administration and maintenance of the Village Hall from the WI who had it built in the 1930s.

About the Trust

The objective of the Trust is to run and maintain the Hall for the benefit of the Village and those who live in it. The Committee is made up of a mixture of members elected via the AGM and representatives of the main activity groups in the Village.

About the Hall

The Hall is the mainstay of most Village activities that require space or fundraising activities to operate. The Hall can accommodate up to 120 people in a range of formats and is regularly used for activities such as presentations, charity lunches and dinners, amateur dramatics, film nights, bridge, art classes, yoga, indoor bowls, pilates, tale tennis, quizzes and coffee mornings.

It is well equipped with all the tables, chairs, kitchen equipment and audio systems to accommodate virtually any need.

Facilities and Charges

Facilities

- The Village Hall is located in the centre of the Village and has extremely good facilities.
- There are tables and padded chairs to accommodate up to 100 people in various formats, theatre, conference or bistro style with small tables.

Charges

The Hall is available 7 days a week, in time slots of morning, afternoon and evening. Hire of the Hall includes all its facilities, with the exception of the committee room.

Typical hire rates for Village activities are £22 a session Sunday to Monday am and pm, £31 for evenings.

The Hall is let in morning, afternoon or evening time slots at very reasonable rates.

- There is a high-quality sound and projection system with Blue Ray DVD player for audio/visual work. The projector and screen are ceiling mounted and can display PC screen via cables.
- The kitchen has facilities to cater for up to 100 people, with a cooker, constant hot water machine for hot drinks, plates and cutlery.
- There is a large stage that can be extended if required, with fast "wind back" curtains.
- A wooden floor that is ideal for all normal use.
- There is a committee room which can be hired separately for meetings of up to 12 people at a cost of £8.50 per session.

Saturday hire is £22 am and pm, £61 for evenings.

There may be a small increase for users from outside the Village, depending on the activity.

There are small savings if a whole day is booked.
